The Chair met Ben Gummer MP, the Department of Health (DH) Minister, to brief him on the background to the Gosport Independent Panel. He showed a keen interest in the Panel's work and a good understanding of the issues. The Minister's DH Portfolio includes Patient Safety and Patient Experience. The Chair and the

		Minister discussed resources and the timeframe for the Panel's work. The Chair confirmed that the Panel keeps a tight rein on its resources particularly in the current tight fiscal climate. He outlined the Panel's developing work on Access, Analysis and Adding to public understanding. He explained that, at present, it was hard to determine the total volume of relevant material from organisations relating to the Panel's Terms of Reference, with a potential consequential impact on the resources required for the Panel's work. The Minister was very supportive of the Panel's work.	
2.	Minutes of 9 June Panel meeting and matters arising	Formal approval of the minutes of the previous meeting is required. Panel members should ensure they are content with the minutes as recorded. 3.	Family Liaison - July's Family Liaison Meeting and update on Communications GIP/Paper 10.1	The Panel is now in contact with 33 families. This is three times the number of families who were initially engaged with the Panel at its announcement in July 2014. Half of the families in contact with the Panel intend to come to the July Family Liaison Meeting. Margaret Aspinall, the Chair of the Hillsborough Family Support Group will attend the Family Liaison Meeting. She will speak to the families and the Panel. The Panel will then withdraw to allow families speak to Margaret Aspinall in private. The Communication Plan has been refined to maximise the impact of the Gosport Independent Panel's planned media activity. A press impact day is scheduled for 30 July. A press release will be sent to local newspapers, TV and radio stations on 27 July, but embargoed until 30 July. Adverts will appear in the agreed newspapers on 30 July. Interviews with the Bishop will be prerecorded for use on 30 July. Phase two of the Communication Plan involves other organisations placing editorials or adverts in community outreach leaflets/newsletters.
