CUNNINGHAM - initial prescription reckless  
- dosage inappropriate - most likely contributed to death

WIKKIE - Prescription - poor practice potentially v. Hazardous

WILSON - Poor & hazardous management  
High risk pneumonia possible would have died without drugs  
Inappropriately treated with drugs - may have contributed to death

PAGE - Prescription poor practice potentially v. Hazardous - inappropriate  
Highly likely caused resp. depression & convulsions cannot  
exclude other causes

Dr MUNDY

CUNNINGHAM - No clear reason for morphine  
dosage range unusually large  
Appropriate increase first as comment to suppress later  
Morphine premature & no clear reasons for increase or  
doses  
no clear conclusions on cause of death

WIKKIE - No clear indication for prescription  
Dose initially excessive. no evidence of review  
dose range unusually large

WILSON - In pain problems swallowing oral  
subcutaneous diamorphine in appropriate dose  
reviewed by Dr pro & final increase  
dose range unusually high.  
Clear suddenly deteriorated - probably due to combination Heart fail  
+ pneumonia  
Palliative care was appropriate

PAGE - Diagnosis lung cancer - no documentation of symptoms  
no documentation of patient pain  
Started opioid, in my view inappropriate  
Start oral medication - of age doses stated.  
Range unusually high.  
Physical condition deteriorated rapidly  
suspect may have had heart attack
