Fareham and Gosport Primary Care Trust Investigation Sultan Ward – GWMH Patient Relative Complaint – Re: N Code A

Introduction and Background:

There are 24 Primary Care beds on Sultan Ward at Gosport War Memorial Hospital.

In order to maximise the use of these beds a decision was taken to admit patients from selected specialities who were nearing the end of an inpatient episode at Queen Alexandra / St. Mary's or Haslar Hospitals. The ward has been taking selected orthopaedic patients since November 1998. These patients are referred to as Step Down Patients.

The ward also admits Young Chronic Sick patients for planned Respite Care - some of the respite care patients are very high dependency and it takes two members of staff several hours per day to give them the care they need The ward also has Palliative care patients and Terminal care patients.

The ward also provides emergency respite care for patients who are unable to cope at home in the short term, due to injury / UTI's / Chest Infections / etc.

The local GP's look after their own patients and those of partners in the same group.
