The Irish News reports that the Royal Victoria Hospital in Belfast is dealing with three urgent referrals a month from people who have experienced problems with weight reduction surgery carried out in private European clinics. The full article is attached.

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Several of the national newspapers report on the Healthcare Commission's findings into the high number of deaths of patients admitted from A&E at Mid Staffordshire NHS foundation trust. The Health Secretary Alan Johnson has rejected calls for a public inquiry.

The Daily Telegraph reports that an inquiry into the deaths of 10 patients, who died whilst receiving palliative care at Gosport War Memorial Hospital a decade ago, is to be held after the Justice Secretary Jack Straw gave special permission for it to go ahead. Dr Jane Barton, who was involved in the care of some of the patients and who has not been charged with any offence following a police investigation, will be one of the witnesses giving evidence.

The Daily Mail covers the court case of Dr Rajinder Aggarwal who has been accused by four female patients of sexual assault by touching. One patient, who visited the doctor after having panic attacks, claimed he advised her to paint the town red and find a man to have sex with to cure the problem.
