It is believed that generally, the doses of drugs to be given in a syringe driver should be prescribed as a fixed dose rather than as a range of doses. Any alterations in the dose are generally prescribed by a doctor, following a reassessment of the patient, number of additional as required doses used of analgesics/sedatives etc. A range is sometimes written in settings where doctors as less readily available on-site to change a prescription.
