Gents.

One of the Nursing assistants at Daedlus Ward: Code A investigation last summer and you may recall Code A She has since left the employ of the Health Trust.

She has made contact having read todays Evening News.

She describes the ward at the "Dead Loss" ward as opposed to Daedlus. She describes the regime of Code A as being geared towards euthenasia.

Although not specifically recalling the Gladys Richards case (she is aware of it) she recalls coming into conflict with Code A over the death of an elderly cancer patient who was put onto a syringe driver and subsequently died.

The patient was always making demands and was considered a nuisance. In her estimation he was some way from death when the driver was introduced. He quickly lapsed into unconciousness and died after 4-5 days.

She also recalls an elderly lady brought onto the ward very ill and immediately put onto a driver. Her family insisted that she be allowed to die naturally without a syringe driver being used. Following the withdrawal she recovered sufficiently to be discharged home to her daughter.

Code A is prepared to make a detailed statement highlighting her concerns . She also indicates that her friend Code A (who has provided a statement) had confrontations with Code A over his readiness to introduce syringe drivers.
