stated that he had been informed by Peter Mellor that the PCT now seemed to want to shift the issue of the inquest onto the PHT. stated that Peter Mellor was keen to speak with BB on the best approach to take. BB provided assurance and stated that there was no need to get worried. She reiterated the fact that the deaths in question had happened over 13 years ago. She stated that the witnesses could only present their view on the staffing levels at the time. BB also said that Mr Jenkins was not criticising those levels; rather, he was using it as evidence to support Dr Barton's actions.

BB did not feel that we should go as far as obtaining evidence from people such as Barbara Robinson. She also stated that Mary Deeks had commented that there was some truth in what was said and in BB's opinion, the less said the better. agreed with this view. BB stated that it may become necessary to review our position later.

Prescription methods

BB stated that Dr Reid need not get worried. She stated that if he did not check or question Dr Barton's prescriptions at the time then that was his evidence and it could not be changed.

BB also noted that Mr Jenkins was missing the point in that he was confusing anticipatory prescribing and prescribing within a range. She stated that the protocol drafted by Dr Reid refers to anticipatory prescribing. She also stated that Prof Black is not critical of prescribing 75622868 1

within a range to allow increase of analgesia without speaking to a Doctor. She also explained that this could be contrasted with anticipatory prescribing which entailed prescribing medicine that was not necessary in the event that the need would arise. BB confirmed that Dr Reid did not support anticipatory prescribing.

BB noted that Dr Reid did not come on the scene until 1999 when he took over from Dr Tandy as Medical Director. BB stated that this was in our favour as Dr Reid had not been involved in previous years when anticipatory prescribing had been used.

Dr Reid's Position

referred to an email sent by BB and said that this had raised concerns with the PHT as they were worried about how this would reflect on Dr Reid. BB stated that it would be unfair to push blame onto Dr Reid. She also stated that Dr Reid needed to be prepared to respond to the allegations in Gillain Hamblin's statement by Monday.
