

Prof. Black states that ~~it~~ is a massive G,I, haemorrhage which is the eventual cause of death & not myocardial infarction as stated on the death certificate. Is this of importance?

Further bleeding (Aug 25<sup>th</sup>) does not lead to any significant investigation due to 'communication difficulties as lab. cannot contact hospital' Why was this not followed through?

Use of drug charts by nursing & clinical staff is defined by Prof. Black as unacceptably poor. Thus rendering the analgesic ladder impossible to verify with any degree of certainty.

Is it possible that deterioration was due to a potentially reversible cause i.e. a peptic or duodenal ulcer which could have been treated?
